

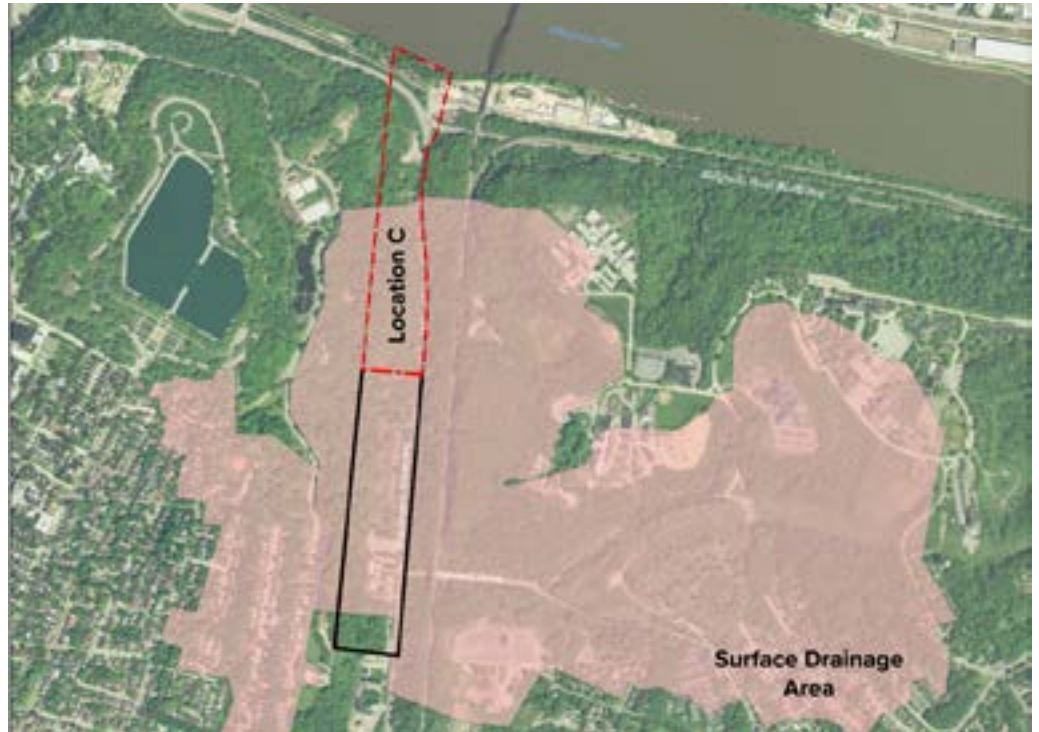
Negley Run Stormwater Management Project

Project Information

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Negley Run Stormwater Management Project, Location C is one of three planned improvements to historic Negley Run. This project is currently in design through a contract funded in partnership between the United States Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) and the Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority (PWSA).

This project is also part of a larger PWSA program to reduce combined sewer overflows in the A-42 sewershed and meet regulatory compliance by installing green stormwater infrastructure solutions. These stormwater solutions will help to reduce flooding and improve public safety during severe rain events.



WHAT TO EXPECT

Location C follows historic Negley Run within Highland Park from north of the Velodrome and adjacent to Washington Boulevard to the Allegheny River. The project will separate stormwater flows from the combined sewer system and improve water quality using natural stormwater systems such as wetlands, daylighted streams, and revegetation. The project also includes evaluating alternatives to reestablish a stormwater only connection to the Allegheny River.

The Army Corp of Engineers and PWSA have recently started final design of Location C. Its design will inform future phases of the project.

Neighborhood Impacts

Field crews are collecting data in Highland Park and along public property north of Allegheny River Boulevard. Data collection includes watershed and geotechnical investigations as well as topographic and utility surveys.

Design Phase

January 2019 - April 2020

Construction Phase

To be determined as design progresses.

PROJECT COORDINATION

PWSA is working closely with community partners, regulatory agencies, and residents including the Negley Run Taskforce, the City of Pittsburgh, PennDOT, and ALCOSAN. The Pittsburgh Parks Conservancy and the RAND Climate Resilience Center are providing additional project support.

Community meetings will be held throughout the project to gather input from community members and park users.
